Campus-based Fees

At the beginning of each year, campus-based fees will be charged for each enrolled student, unless the student has been enrolled in the College's School-based Apprenticeship/Traineeship Fee (SbAT) program. The fees will be charged as detailed in the above schedule.

School-based Apprenticeship / Traineeship (SBAT)

The fee for **Year 12 students** undertaking a School-based Apprenticeship / Traineeship (SbAT), from the beginning of the school year, on the College's standard SbAT program, is set at \$1 390.

For SbATs commencing during the school year, the Tuition Fee is adjusted on a pro-rata basis to reflect the proportion of the year spent as a campus-based student, and the SbAT fee will be charged, but adjusted, based on the start date of the SbAT.

The College has a number of alternate SbAT models in place to meet the requirements of the employers and industries we work with. These models also acknowledge that individual students move through the requirements of their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) at different rates.

Year 11 students who commence a SbAT during the school year, each SbAT model has its own discounted Tuition Fee structure based primarily on the number of days the student is required to attend campus-based classes and each has its own pro-rata formula to accommodate various start dates. The relevant discounted Tuition Fee structure will be outlined as part of the process of a student entering into a SbAT Contract of Training.

* Please note that adjustments to the year's Tuition Fee are not made when a SbAT is commenced during Term 4.

Payment options

Fees are payable by cash, cheque, credit card, BPay, EFTPOS or Centrepay deductions, either:

- in full by **1 March 2019**; (Term 1, Week 5);
- in three equal instalments by **1 March 2019** (Term 1, Week 5), **31 May 2019** (Term 2, Week 5) and **6 September 2019** (Term 3, Week 7); or
- in fortnightly instalments, to be finalised by **6 September 2019** (Term 3, Week 7).

Students exiting the College during the year

If a student leaves the College during the year, signatories to the *Contract of Enrolment* are responsible for fees owing up to and including the remainder of that term. Adjustments will be made to the Tuition Fee only. Adjustments to the Tuition Fee are not made when a student exits during Term 4.

Students enrolling during the year

If a student commences at the College during the year, signatories to the *Contract of Enrolment* will be charged the *Resource Fee* plus an adjusted *Tuition Fee* calculated on a pro-rata basis reflecting the proportion of the year the student is enrolled.

Scholarships and financial assistance

Government assistance, scholarships and grants are available to low income families. A 40% fee remission on the *Tuition Fee* is available to families eligible for *School Card*.

Families experiencing financial difficulties are encouraged to contact the College Finance Manager to discuss options to assist with payment.

Application Fees

A non-refundable *Application Fee* of \$50 is payable when lodging an *Application for Enrolment*.

Once an application has been processed and is accepted, a formal offer will be made in writing. Enrolment will only be confirmed by returning appropriate documentation at that time with an *Enrolment Guarantee Acceptance Fee* of \$150. This fee will be credited against the first year's tuition fees. This fee is non-refundable should the student not commence at the College.
